Her varied experience includes acting for the stage and camera, writing, art directing, assistant directing and directing. She has also been a facilitator and coach for various workshops and classes, and a past member of the board of directors for Women In Film and Video Vancouver.

With post graduate degrees from the University of Victoria and the University of British Columbia, (education, history and film studies), Terri Anne has participated in a variety of film and television projects over the past several years. She is proud to work in and support the Vancouver film industry and its community, especially in her current role as the Academic Director of the Digital Film and Video Program at the Art Institute of Vancouver.

She has always held a special fascination with both film and World War I and II History. She is pleased to join members of our Society for an evening of remembrance regarding some of her favourite subject material.
